9/25 Forbidden Zone New 35mm Print! Deliriously insane, fast-paced musical fantasy about a girl who dis-

covers a bizarre kingdom behind her basement door. This campy cult classic stars Hervé Villechaize (Tattoo in "Fantasy Island") and Susan Tyrrell as the King and Queen of the Sixth Dimension and features original music by Mystic Knights of the Oingo-Boingo with Danny Elfman, who plays Satan in the film and is brother of director/co-writer Richard Elfman. 10/2 Army of Darkness

An outrageously comic sword-and-sorcery fantasy, Army of Darkness is the concluding chapter of director Sam Raimi's Evil Dead trilogy. Bruce Campbell (Bubba Ho-tep) returns as our innocent, wise-cracking hero, who's hurtled by mysterious forces into the Dark Ages to battle an army of the dead for the chance to return to his own time. 10/9 A Clockwork Orange

Stanley Kubrick's nightmarish, satiric horror show has lost none of its power to shock. Malcolm McDowell portrays Alex, a Beethovenloving, head-bashing punk who leads his gang of "droogs" on ultraviolent assaults-until he is captured by authorities and subjected to nasty behavior-modification therapy. Got milk? (UK, 1971)

10/16 The NeverEnding Story

Wolfgang Petersen's (Das Boot, The Perfect Storm) first English-language film takes us on a fairytale ride to the land of Fantasia, where a little boy is literally drawn into the pages of the book he is reading. Outstanding special effects and a pulsating score by Giorgio Moroder compliment the magical adventure and fantastic creatures. (Germany/UK, 1984)



10/23 Edward Scissorhands

Tim Burton's magical and poignant fantasy tells the story of a young man (Johnny Depp) with sharp shears of metal for hands. After being orphaned by his creator (Vincent Price), he finds his talents utilized to create fabulous hairstyles and lawn hedges! Winona Ryder co-stars. A tender and satirical fairy tale from the director of Ed Wood, Pee-Wee's Big Adventure and Big Fish. (USA, 1990)

10/30 The Lost Boys

Brothers Jason Patric and Corey Haim move to a California seaside town with mom Dianne Weist, only to discover that their new home is being terrorized by a pack of hip, handsome, motorcycle-riding vampires-led by bad-boy Kiefer Sutherland. Jami Gertz and that other Corey (Feldman) are also featured in this glossy, blood-sucking tale from Joel Schumacher, director of Flatliners. (USA, 1987)

11/6 Fight Club

Controversial drama starring Brad Pitt as a sociopath who creates an underground organization of "fight clubs" in which young men with white-collar jobs engage in no-holds-barred bouts. Edward Norton and Helena Bonham Carter co-star. From David Fincher, director of Seven and Panic Room. (USA, 1999)

11/13 Fear and Loathing in Las Vegas

Visually explosive, offbeat pop culture comedy based on Hunter S. Thompson's cult book that chronicled the writer's drink-and-drugfueled business trip to Las Vegas. Johnny Depp, Benicio Del Toro, Tobey Maguire and Cameron Diaz star. Directed by Terry Gilliam (Brazil, 12 Monkeys). (USA, 1998)
